
The Local Bookshelf

As we come into Spring here are some titles to tempt nature lovers.



Once there were wolves by Charlotte McConaghy. Inti Flynn arrives in Scotland with one purpose – to reintroduce gray wolves into the highlands despite the fierce resistance from the local population. When a farmer is mauled to death, Inti buries the evidence, terrified the locals will accuse her beloved wolves.

But if the wolves aren't to blame, who caused his death? This is a beautiful novel about healing from trauma, both in people and in nature.



The great alone by Kristin Hannah. A recently returned Vietnam War POW, Ernt Allbright decides to move his family to the Alaskan frontier. At first, Alaska seems to be the answer to their prayers and just what Ernt needs. But when the harsh Alaskan winter approaches and Ernt's mental state begins to deteriorate,

his wife and daughter must fight to survive. A captivating novel.




The botanist's daughter by Kayte Nunne. Kayte grew up in England and the U.S. but has lived in Australia for the past 25 years. This is her first foray into historical fiction for which she was awarded the 2020 Winston Graham Historical Fiction Prize. A dual-timeline tale of two female botanists, separated by more

than a century, in a race to discover a life-saving flower.



The signature of all things by Elizabeth Gilbert. Well researched, The Signature of All Things takes the reader across the globe—from London to Peru and beyond. Along the way, the story is peopled with unforgettable characters but most memorable of all, it is the story of Alma Whittaker, who—born in the Age

of Enlightenment, but living well into the Industrial Revolution—bears witness to that extraordinary moment in human history when all the old assumptions about science, religion, commerce, and class were exploding into dangerous new ideas.



A walk in the woods by Bill Bryson. Published in 2006 and made into a so-so film with Robert Redford in 2015 this is a non-fiction 'oldie but a goodie'. Back in America after twenty years in Britain, Bill Bryson decided to reacquaint himself with his native country by walking the 2,100-mile Appalachian Trail, which

stretches from Georgia to Maine. The trail offers an astonishing landscape of silent forests and sparkling lakes—and to a writer with the comic genius of Bill Bryson, it also provides endless opportunities to witness the majestic silliness of his fellow human beings.

It's time to Beat the Bite!



We need to protect ourselves from being bitten at this time of year as mosquitoes become more prevalent in the environment. The recent floods and wetter than usual winter have created ideal breeding conditions for mosquitoes.

"With residents and visitors starting to enjoy the outdoors and explore our lakes, rivers and waterways, it is important to take some simple steps to reduce the risks of being bitten by mosquitoes," Gannawarra Shire Council Chief Executive Officer, Tom O'Reilly said. "Whilst most mosquitoes are just a nuisance, others can carry diseases, such as Ross River Virus Disease and Japanese Encephalitis."

How can you protect yourself?

- limiting outdoor activity when mosquitoes are most active (dawn, dusk, night)
- wearing long, loose fitting clothes, and applying a mosquito repellent containing picaridin or DEET to exposed skin when outdoors.
- removing stagnant water from around the home to reduce mosquito breeding sites.
- using a knockdown fly-spray or surface spray to reduce adult mosquitoes and the risk of being bitten around homes.

Council officers have been undertaking mosquito control activities across the Gannawarra over the past two weeks as part of the annual Victorian Mosquito Management and Control Program, overseen by the Department of Health.

"Some targeted fogging to kill adult mosquitoes on public land may also occur."

"Items like pot plant stands, animal watering containers, rainwater tanks, blocked guttering, and

unmaintained swimming pools can become significant breeding sites on private land," Mr O'Reilly said. To reduce mosquito breeding on larger properties, mosquito control products are readily available from local rural supply and select hardware stores or by engaging the services of a licenced pest controller.



Cohuna Lions Club Memorial Garden

Cohuna Lions Club has joined Lions Australia in celebrating 75 years' service to the community and also 60 years' service to their own community by installing a memorial garden. The garden also commemorates deceased members of the Cohuna Lions Club.

The chosen site was a piece of waste land at the end of a local park. The land for the park had been donated to the community many years ago by a local stock agent, C L King, and is named in his honour.

This project required much planning and work for the Lions members; a grant was applied for, extensive consultation with the Gannawarra Shire, advice and planning sought from a local nursery, assistance from local tradespeople and suppliers.



The plan was drawn up and plants purchased from the nursery. The plot was cleared of grass and weeds by the Lions members.

Wet weather caused continual interruptions and prolonged the project, but the Lions members pressed on, meeting twice a week in addition to their other weekly commitments at their wood-yard and delivering wood to the local residents.

After many weeks of work and frustration with the weather the park started to take shape and the Lions could start to see the results of their hard work in transforming the area.

Installation of edging, compost, gravel paths, low care and hardy plants and a watering system was completed.

Finally, it was ready to be officially opened on the designated date, September 29^{th} 2022.

Invitations were extended to neighbouring Lions clubs, Lions Ladies, Gannawarra Shire Councillors and members of the community. PDG Norm Walkington, Zone Chairman Jeanette Cowan and project co-ordinator Rob Shanahan spoke and the garden was opened by Cr Garner Smith.

Mrs Beth Wood, whose husband Charlie was a dedicated Lion and the grandson of C L King, reminisced about the enjoyment Lions had given them over the years and also in seeing the park development.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Relief Assistance for Flood Affected Farmers

The Victorian Government is supporting primary producers across Victoria affected by the floods, with:

Clean up Relief Grants: \$10,000 payments to cover the costs of clean up and get businesses up and running again.

Concessional loans: Up to \$250,000 to restore or replace flood damaged equipment or infrastructure

Transport Subsidies: Up to \$15,000 to support transport of emergency fodder, stock drinking water and livestock movement

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Relief Assistance

The Victorian Government is providing emergency relief assistance for community members whose homes have been impacted by the current flood emergency in Victoria.

If your home has been affected by flooding, you can get a one-off emergency payment.

This payment is for immediate relief, including food, shelter, clothing, medication, accommodation. Emergency relief assistance is based on a fixed amount for each member of your household (adults and children).

Payments of \$580 per adult and \$290 per child (up to a maximum of \$2030 per eligible family) are available.

Re-establishment Assistance

You can get financial help to return home if:

- You cannot live in your home because it is damaged or destroyed OR
- You cannot access your home for more than 7 days because of flooding

Re-establishment assistance is only available for your principal place of residence. It can help to pay for clean-up, emergency accommodation, repairs, rebuilding your home, replacing some damaged contents.

This help is means tested. You can only get it if you:

- Do not have building (home) insurance or contents insurance AND
- · Are experiencing financial hardship

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Disaster Recovery Allowance (DRA)

The disaster recovery allowance (DRA) is for employees and sole traders who lose income because of a major disaster. You can get payments for up to 13 weeks after the disaster happens. These payments are taxable.

Australian Government Disaster Recovery Payment (AGDRP)

This is for people who have suffered a significant loss because of the floods. This includes:

- · If your home was severely damaged or destroyed
- · If you suffered a serious injury

Adults can get \$1,000 and children can get \$400, if they are eligible.
