Geoff Rollinson appointed Gannawarra Shire Council CEO

Gannawarra Shire Council has appointed Geoff Rollinson as its new Chief Executive Officer for a three-year term.

Mr Rollinson is Council's former Director of Infrastructure and Development, and began in his new role on 22 December, replacing former Chief Executive Officer, Tom O'Reilly.

"Council is excited to have appointed Geoff and begin working with him in his new role," Mayor Charlie Gillingham said. "Geoff is well regarded within the Gannawarra community, having worked with Gannawarra Shire Council and the former Borough and Shire of Kerang. Geoff's experience will also assist Council to continue providing key services to our communities and achieving the goals outlines in the Growing Gannawarra – 2021-2025 Council Plan" Mr Rollinson has been with Gannawarra Shire Council since the amalgamation of the Borough and Shire of Kerang with the Shire of Cohuna in 1995, holding Works Engineer, Manager of Operational Services and Director of Infrastructure and Development roles with Council during this time. He has also been Acting Chief Executive Officer during the 2022 floods, using the experience he gained during the January 2011 floods to assist the community respond to the second major flood event this century.

"I thank the Gannawarra Shire Councillors for appointing me to this important role," Mr Rollinson said. "I am fortunate to have lived in the Gannawarra for most of my career with Council, which has helped foster relationships with the community. I look forward to working with the Councillors and the community in not only helping the Gannawarra recover from the 2022 floods, but to continue to make the Gannawarra a great place to live and work."

The Local Bookshelf

Looking for some new authors? Here are three Australian writers (and their latest books) making big impressions both at home and abroad.

The Seven Skins of Esther Wilding by Holly Ringland. The last time Esther Wilding's beloved older sister Aura was seen, she was walking along the shore towards the sea. To seek the truth about her sister's death, Esther travels from Tasmania to Copenhagen, and then to the Faroe Islands. On her journey, Esther is guided by the stories Aura left behind: fairy tales about selkies, swans and women, alongside cryptic verses Aura wrote and had tattooed on her body. The story is by no means a fast read; it's a chunky book full of mystery and folklore. Holly Ringland grew up in her mother's tropical garden on the east coast of Australia. After wanting to be a writer since she was three years old, Holly's debut novel *The Lost Flowers of Alice Hart* was published in 2018 when she was 37 years old. It has since become an international bestseller commissioned to be adapted into a television series.





ROBBIE ARNOTT

Limberlost by Robbie Arnott. In the heat of a long summer Ned hunts rabbits in a river valley, hoping the pelts will earn him enough money to buy a small boat. His two brothers are away at war, their whereabouts unknown. His taciturn father and older sister struggle to hold things together on the family orchard, Limberlost. While the narrative largely unfolds over the course of a summer, it also weaves in glimpses of Ned's future life as a husband and father to show how the choices he makes as a 15-year-old have long-lasting repercussions in the decades ahead. Robbie Arnott's acclaimed debut, *Flames* (2018), won a Sydney Morning Herald Best Young Novelist award and a Tasmanian Premier's Literary Prize. His follow-up, *The Rain Heron* (2020), won the Age Book of the Year award, and was shortlisted for the Miles Franklin Literary Award. He lives in Hobart.

The Sun Walks Down by Fiona McFarlane. In September 1883, the South Australian town of Fairly huddles under strange, vivid sunsets. Six-year-old Denny Wallace has gone missing during a dust storm, and the whole town is intent on finding him. As they search the desert and mountains for the lost child, the residents of Fairly - newlyweds, landowners, farmers, mothers, artists, Indigenous trackers, cameleers, children, schoolteachers, widows, maids, policemen - explore their own relationships with the complex landscape unsettling history of the Flinders Ranges

FIONA MEPARLANE THE SUN WALKS DOWN

Fiona McFarlane is the author of the novel *The Night Guest*, which was shortlisted for the Miles Franklin Literary Award, and a collection of short stories, *The High Places*, which won the International Dylan Thomas Prize. Born in Sydney, Fiona teaches creative writing at the University of California, Berkeley.

Council adopts Walking and Cycling Strategy

A new strategy will assist Gannawarra Shire Council with the ongoing development and management of walking and cycling tracks and trails throughout the municipality. Adopted at the December 2022 Council Meeting, the *Gannawarra Shire Council Walking and Cycling*



Strategy features 21 actions, split into five strategic outcomes, that aim to enhance walking and cycling opportunities within towns across the Gannawarra and connections between communities. "The Gannawarra is renowned for its connections to nature, with our various walking and cycling tracks and trails providing everyone the opportunities to explore these areas," Mayor Charlie Gillingham said.

"The *Gannawarra Shire Council Walking and Cycling Strategy* not only highlights what walking and cycling options residents and visitors can access now, but also identifies improvements that can be made to enhance these opportunities."

Development of the strategy began earlier this year with in-person workshops and on-site meetings held across the Gannawarra, as well as an online workshop and the opportunity for residents to provide input via an online survey.

"Council received 11 submissions during this community feedback period, with much of the feedback incorporated into the adopted version of the document," Mayor Gillingham said.

"Council thanks all residents who took the time to provide input regarding this strategy and looks forward to working with our State and Federal counterparts to obtain support to act upon the actions listed in the document."

B2.2 Upgrade signage and waymarking, throughout Gilrule and Cohuna Nature Walk.

B2.3 Enhance and develop the Ski Run Trail and its support infrastructure.

B2.4 Develop consistent and clear signage throughout Cohuna to improve connectivity of trails networkand linkages to key areas.

B2.5 Extend and link existing trails to Gunbower Forest, to improve access to natural features and neighboring townships.
