1948: The Amalgamation of Cohuna and District Primary Schools

One's life journey is a continual journey of education, only interrupted by my days at school.

George Bernard Shaw

This year – 2023, will see the Cohuna Consolidated School celebrating 75 years of primary school education in Cohuna.

There is a long and proud history associated with the Cohuna Consolidated School, starting with discussions way back during the Second World War years when the community charged a group of people with the aim of merging all of the local schools, spread throughout the community.

The desire to do so came about from the changing nature of our community, even in those times. School numbers in certain schools had dropped dramatically with the arrival of better roads and school buses, and there was a need to provide better local facilities for primary education for young children.

After lengthy consultation, a small delegation consisting of Jim Owens, Wilfred Fry and Edward Hore met with the Victorian Government and reached an agreement. The amalgamation of the schools then took place in 1948.

The schools that were part of the amalgamation were: Dalton's bridge, 21 pupils; McMillan's, 24 pupils; Cohuna State, 17 pupils. Gannawarra, 20 pupils; Horfield, 15 pupils. The largest of all was Burke's Bridge, with 46 pupils. These pupils joined the Cohuna State and Higher Elementary school as it was known then, starting on April 4, 1948, with the last of the schools coming together on May 3, 1948. This increased the number of children attending school from 139 to 288.

To cater for the extra students, buildings from close schools and other places were transported to the school site to be used as classrooms, canteens and other workplaces required by the school. At the time, it was known as a Cohuna State and Higher Elementary school, referred to locally as The Red Brick building.

The Cohuna High School, now Secondary College, was established sometime later in 1955.

One of the past students, Mr Les Fry, who attended Burke's Bridge school, feels it's important to celebrate the 75-year amalgamation of all the district schools. It certainly had a significant impact on schooling and education throughout our community and the Cohuna Consolidated School has gone on to educate and deliver many outstanding results for its students.

COHUNA STATE SCHOOL

Permissive occupancy of 8 ½ acres of land adjoining the school property was secured from the Land Department in 1942. This area had been at the disposal of the school for purposes of Sport for many years. Plans for tree planting of the area commenced immediately. During wet weather playing space was seriously restricted as quite an area of this land was under water.

During 1947 a committee worked unceasingly for the establishment of a consolidated school at Cohuna. This eventuated in 1948. Schools that contributed to the consolidation were: -

Dalton's Bridge	on	9-4-48	with	21	pupils
McMillans	on	9-4-48	With	24	pupils
Cohuna Estate	on	12-4-48	With	17	Pupils
Gannawarra	on	15-4-48	With	20	Pupils
Horefield	on	21-4-48	With	15	Pupils
Burkes Bridge	on	3-5-48	With	46	Pupils

The number of children attending the Primary section of the school rose from 139 to 288 in 1948.

Country school buildings that were moved on to the site at that time or a little later came from Horefield, Cohuna Estate, McMillanas, Keely, Torrumbarry North and Witchetella. The schools from Torrumbarry North and Witchetella were condemned in 1965 and removed from site in 1966. The others continued to be used as classrooms. Art/Craft room and Cafeteria.

Gannawarra Memoríal Toy Run 2022

This year the Gannawarra Memorial Toy run raised \$20,000 in total. They applied for and were awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Freemasons Foundation Victoria and raised another \$10,000 themselves. This was an exceptional effort, considering the damage wrought to the roads by rain and floods. Somehow every town managed to remain involved. People rode their bikes down from Melbourne, Swan Hill, Bendigo and Deniliquin.

The "Show & Shine" competition, where cars, bikes and utes etc. compete for a trophy was a big success. They finished with a Leo's lunch and a treat from the ice-cream van. Despite the floods, the Toy Run raised as much as last year and delivered quality toy bags. Coordinator John Webb said all \$20,000 has been distributed, with donations made to those organisation who provide hampers: St Vinnies, Kerang Neighbourhood House and Cohuna Neighbourhood House. The Shire assisted by halving the rental price of the Hall. John said it's all about the kids and the families.

The Toy Run bank account is amalgamated with the accounts of the Men's Breakfast and the Anglican Church.

The idea for the Toy Run sprang from a conversation at the Men's Breakfast. The word "Memorial" originally referred to bike riders they had lost, but is significant for anyone who has lost someone. COHUNA GARDEN LOVERS in 2023

Our first meeting for the year was held on Friday 10th February. We welcomed Tanya Black, manager of Cohuna Neighbourhood House as our guest speaker. Tanya spoke about the development of their Community Garden. The idea started around their Food Bank, of growing fresh food for people to come and collect. They wanted it to look nice, to be respected, and to look cared for and loved, as well as being available for people of all abilities.

Tanya applied for and gained grants from Gannawarra Shire Resilience funding. They partnered with the Men's Shed who made the wicking beds. Plastic lining, Geotech fabric and scoria were donated and used to set up the beds. The planting up has been done by many volunteers. Currently, Alan Fry oversees the garden and organises the seedlings. The produce is available to all for people to enjoy. One of our members explained how it was lovely to be able to pick a few leaves of silver beet, or parsley sprigs, to take home and use for their dinner that night.

Looking to the future, Neighbourhood House has a grant from the Shire for \$125.000 to build a new kitchen, repurpose some rooms and provide a disabled toilet. This will enable links with different cultures who may come in and cook food to share. Landscaping and an outdoor area will also be provided. The CWA have given funds for a memorial seat to be showcased under a vine Arbor to recognise their work in the community over a long period of time. It really is a Community Garden! Cohuna Garden Lovers meet on the second Friday of the month at 1.30pm in the Shire Meeting Room. Our program includes guest speakers, members sharing skills and knowledge, and days out visiting gardens or nurseries. We have a small competition bench, including a floral cut, flowering shrub, fruit or vegetable, and a possession, plus an excellent trading table.

Our next meeting will be held on Friday 10th March and

Robyn Schack will explain "How to care for our cut flowers", something that might be important for those competing in the Cohuna Show. All are welcome to join
